


Political -Science Club



RED RIBBON CLUB

RIBBON CLUB (RRC): Red Ribbon Club of SD Jain Girls' College works under the aegis of Nagaland State AIDS Control Society (NSACS). NSACS on the other hand comes under the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO) which was established in 1992 is a division of India's Ministry of Health and Family Welfare that provides leadership to HIV and AIDS control programme in India through HIV & AIDS Prevention and Control Societies and is the nodal Organisation for formulation of policy and implementation of programs for prevention and control of HIV and AIDS in India.

RRC in Nagaland:

On the third of August, 2006 under the initiative of the former honorable governor of Nagaland Shri Shyamal Dutta The Red Ribbon Club programs were launched in the state.

The Red Ribbon, as an awareness ribbon, is used as the symbol for the solidarity of people living with HIV / AIDS and for the awareness and prevention of HIV/ AIDS.

Objectives

- 1. Educate youth with correct, concise and clear information and increase their level of awareness about HIV / AIDS and other related issues (eliminate myths and misconceptions).
- 2. Sensitize the youth regarding care and support needs of people affected with HIV/ AIDS and in still in them the spirit to reduce the stigma and discrimination against them.
- Create and train the youth cadre of peer educators for spreading awareness about HIV/ AIDS and its prevention in the community.

Red Ribbon Club of SD Jain Girls' College promotes access to information on healthy life and voluntary blood donation. It creates and provides opportunities to work as volunteers and social workers to contribute towards the control and prevention of HIV / AIDS. The RRC is a voluntary On-campus intervention program for students. The works under the club are inter- related in areas of voluntary blood donation, HIV/ AIDS and healthy living.
